Dear Families,

As we edge towards the end of the term, we have a number of exciting events to look forward to:

### Nativity (EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2)

Thursday, 12th December at 9.20am and Friday, 13th December at 1.30pm

Please be aware, this is not a ticketed event but it is usual that one or two parents/carers attend one of the performances rather than both. Please ensure your child knows which performance you will attend so they know in advance and are not disappointed if they cannot see you! On the Friday, 13th December performance, you are welcome to take your child afterwards (approximately 2.30pm, siblings too) once they have changed back into their school uniform. However, we can also keep your child until 3.15pm as usual if that is more convenient.

#### **FWR Christmas Fair**

FWR are kindly hosting the Christmas Fair on Tuesday, 17th December which will be a wonderful community event for everyone to enjoy. We will dismiss the children at the white/green gates as usual and then re-open the gates for everyone to come into the School Hall for the Fair.

### **Carols Around The Tree (whole school)**

Please be aware, this is not a ticketed event but it is usual that no more than two parents/carers attend due to available space in the Hall. As per the email sent earlier this term, EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2 children will sit in front of the stage and so may not be as clearly visible as the older years. This is due to EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2 having already performed the Nativity this week. Children (and families!) are welcome to wear Christmas jumpers/a festive accessory with their usual school uniform if they so wish.

We had a record of 50 Western Road participants this year and there were 312 students in total from 7 local schools competing. Western Road did incredibly well with 8 students finishing in the top 3. ### **School Council**

The School Council and Debating Group had a fantastic visit to Lewes Town Hall. We were interested to find out about the role of the councillors as well as learning how decisions are made in the locality. ## Attendance and Punctuality



In August 2024, the Government published the statutory guidance on attendance (see link below). As per the guidance, parents and carers are expected to:

Only request leave of absence in exceptional circumstances and do so in advance;

Book any medical appointments around the school day where possible.

Please ensure your child arrives at school on time - the gates open at 8.40am and close at 8.50am. Any child arriving after this time must be signed in at the School Office, as per our health and safety and attendance policies.

## Reminder: Arbor - School Trips and Club Payments

If the date of the trip or club has elapsed, you will no longer be able to confirm attendance. Again, please drop me a line with your child's name and club/trip, and I can push this through.

For those of you it has worked seamlessly for, we hope you agree that having the trip added to your child's calendar has been useful.

As we become a bit more familiar with the setup process, trips will start appearing within a much broader timeframe. Clubs, swimming reminders, INSET days, photo days and Parents Evenings, will all start appearing in this calendar, making Arbor a 'one stop shop' for all things Western Road!

## Reminder - school uniform



### Western Road Community Primary School's Uniform consists of:

- Navy school fleece with school logo (optional but these are very warm and ideal for Winter and Spring)
- Navy school jumper with or without school logo or navy or mid-grey cardigan
- White shirt/blouse with long or short sleeves with or without logo or
- White or navy blue polo shirt with or without school logo
- Mid-grey or navy trousers or smart shorts, or
- Mid-grey or navy skirts (or skorts), pinafore dresses or school summer dresses (blue/white check)
- White/navy/grey socks or tights
- Plain black or navy school shoes (or plain black or navy trainers with no logos); plain sandals in the Summer terms only.
- Plain hair accessories (optional and in school colours preferably). Long hair (past shoulder length) must be tied back.

### PE kit:

White T-shirt or polo shirt with school logo (or plain)

- Grey or navy shorts or jogging bottoms (plain with no logos)
- Trainers or plimsolls

Please note, hoodies and jewellery (apart from a wristwatch when appropriate or stud earrings that can be taken out for PE) are not part of the school uniform and must not be worn in school.

The school also has school caps, rucksacks and book bags available. Please ensure all items of clothing are named including shoes or trainers.

Navy blue polo shirts, fleeces and sweatshirts with the school logo on are all available from Intersport http://www.gameforlife.co.uk/section.php/781/1/western\_road\_cp\_school.

Second-hand items are regularly available at low cost at school fairs and events.

Reminder - Message from the Bursar, Sarah Clifford



Please ensure your ParentPay accounts for dinner money are cleared at the end of each week, or (ideally) are in credit by a small amount. **School dinners cost £2.97 per day for children in Years 3 - 6.** 

Children under 5 are entitled to free school milk each day, given at morning snack time (this is in addition to milk given to children who have school lunches). If you would like your child to



If you think your child might be entitled to **Free School Meals** (regardless of their age) through the **Pupil Premium Grant**, please do look at <a href="https://www.eastsussex.gov.uk/education-learning/schools/school-life/school-meals/free-school-meals">https://www.eastsussex.gov.uk/education-learning/schools/school-life/school-meals/free-school-meals</a> for more information. If your child is entitled to Free School Meals and/or the Pupil Premium Grant, the school will receive additional funding to support them with their learning and enrichment activities.

From this term, we will put all school trips and school-run clubs (for example Sewing Club) through Arbor so please do make sure you are able to login. We will continue to use ParentPay for Chartwells payments.

## News from Silver Birch (EYFS)

We have thoroughly enjoyed this term's learning. We have continued to think about 'Celebrations!' We were interested to find out about Diwali. The children enjoyed listening to the story of Rama and Sita and how good won over darkness! The children were particularly keen to make representations of the mean Ravana. We made models, paintings and clay models. The children also made beautiful Diwa lamps which will look beautiful when lit.

Our learning topic has moved on to thinking about Christmas. We have been learning about why Christmas is an important time of year for Christians. Our learning was enhanced with a wonderful visit to Trinity Church, Southover, where we listened to the Christmas story and found out a little about what happens in a church.

We have also been discussing how many people celebrate Christmas and the festive period. Over the next coming weeks we will be learning about Hanukkah. Whilst talking about celebrations, we have been thinking about similarities and differences between the ways in which different important events are celebrated. What a lovely, exciting, colourful and joyful term of learning!

## News from Elm Class (Year 1)



Year 1 have had an extremely busy Term 2. In Art this term we have been focusing on Van Gogh's 'Starry Night', however we have also been learning about various artists to include Kandinsky, Yayoi Kusama and Jackson Pollock. The children have enjoyed learning about their lives and have produced artwork inspired by the own artist's work.

In Computing the children have become news broadcasters. They initially chose a planet to speak about, selected images and factual information to share with the audience. They were then filmed against a green screen sharing their factual information with their chosen images to create the broadcast.

We are looking forward to showing our parents the children's wooden Christmas houses on Wednesday, 18th December at 2.30 to 3.00pm (after Carols Around The Tree).

## News from Cherry Class (Year 2)



In Year 2, students have been exploring the fascinating world of science and history through exciting hands-on activities. They've been conducting ice experiments, testing how quickly ice melts in different temperatures and learning about the science behind freezing and thawing. As part of their history lessons, the class has been researching the incredible adventures of Ernest Shackleton and his polar expeditions, discovering how he and his crew braved the harsh conditions of Antarctica. To bring their learning to life, the students even embarked on their own "expedition," using their imaginations to journey through icy landscapes. Afterward, they

wrote detailed diary entries about their adventures, reflecting on the challenges and triumphs of their journey—just like real explorers!

## News from Larch Class (Year 3)



To celebrate our topic of learning, Year 3 had an Ancient Egyptian Day. The costumes were creative and eye catching. We had a mix of pharaohs, gods and mummies. Thank you to the parents for such splendid fancy dress, the children were proud to show off their outfits. We had several activities planned over the day which included making clay sarcophagus's, virtual tours of ancient tombs and playing senet (traditional board game that was found in King Tutankhamun's tomb).

## News from Willow Class (Year 4)



In Year 4, we continue having a fantastic term with many exciting learning opportunities. One of the highlights has been our tremendous Brass Band performance. The children practised hard, and it truly paid off as they performed with confidence and skill. It was wonderful to see their enthusiasm and teamwork, and we are very proud of their musical achievements!

In PE, we have been focusing on building our fundamental movement skills. The children have been thoroughly enjoying a variety of activities that help develop their coordination, balance, and agility. A favourite this term has been hopscotch, where they were working to improve their hopping and jumping skills.

As part of our Geography topic on Extreme Weather, we had a visit from the Lewes Fire Service. The firefighters shared valuable insights into the infamous Lewes floods, explaining the impact it had on our town. We learnt about the flood prevention measures that have been put in place to protect the area. It was a great way to bring our topic to life, and the children were fascinated by the real-life application of what they have been learning.

In Art, we have been exploring various weather types through a range of creative techniques. The children used collage, watercolour, and pen and ink to capture the different moods and elements of weather, taking inspiration from other artists. From stormy skies to sunny days, the students experimented with texture and colour to express a range of weather patterns.

In Science, we've been exploring electricity by creating circuits and testing materials for conductivity. The children had a great time experimenting with different materials to see which

ones are conductors and which are insulators. They learned that some materials, like metals, allow electricity to flow, while others, like rubber or wood, do not. The hands-on experiments were a great way to reinforce their understanding of how electrical circuits work!

## News from Elder Class (Year 5)

Year 5 enjoyed a wonderful photography workshop on Thursday, 28th November. Thank you very much to parent and photographer Maxine Silver, who worked with the children to take photographic portraits of each other using DSLR cameras. The children were able to do choreograph head and body shots to capture their subjects with objects they had brought in to represent their hobbies and interests, considering angles, lighting and other aspects of composition. It was very engaging and informative for the children to learn how to use DSLR cameras and apply their creativity to the photography. They got some stunning shots!

## News from Oak Class (Year 6)



This week, Year 6 have been working hard on their stop motion animations in Computing. After recapping our learning from Year 5, we meticulously planned our different stories, making sure that they linked to our 'Victorians' topic. We then carefully made our resources, before using the stop motion app to create our animations. All of the children's projects are very innovative, involving time-travelling aliens, suffragettes and even the Crimean War!

## Reminder - football kits (Thursdays)



Children who attend Albion In The Community after-school club on Thursdays should come to school in their usual school uniform and school shoes/plain black trainers. The football coaches arrive with plenty of time to supervise the children getting changed into their kits before the club starts at 3.15pm. Please ensure all kit (including boots, shin pads etc) are clearly named. Thank you.

## Reminder: Child Protection and Safeguarding



At Western Road Community Primary, all staff take child protection and safeguarding children very seriously, both in person and online. All staff have been trained in Safeguarding and Child Protection. If you have any concerns about a child's well-being, bullying or e-safety, please contact the Designated Safeguarding Leads (DLSs): Mrs Hamilton or Mrs Wooler.

During Assemblies, we have reminded all children that if they are worried or anxious at any time, they can talk to any trusted adult in school and who the DSLs are too.

As a school we are also part of Operation Encompass which is a police and education early information safeguarding partnership enabling schools to offer immediate support to children experiencing domestic abuse. Operation Encompass ensures that there is a simple telephone call or notification to a school's trained Designated Safeguarding Lead /Officer (known as key Adult) prior to the start of the next school day after an incident of police attended domestic abuse where there are children related to either of the adult parties involved. Information is shared with a school's Key Adult (Designated Safeguarding Lead or Officer) prior to the start of the next school day after officers have attended a domestic abuse incident. This sharing of information enables appropriate support to be given, dependent upon the needs and wishes of the child.
